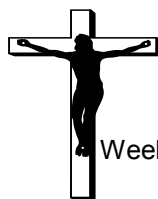

Fortnight for Freedom—is a call to fourteen days of prayer, education, and action for religious freedom in the United States and abroad.

This year's Fortnight for Freedom is June 21 to July 4th.

This Two-week period is a time when our liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power, including St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher, St. John the Baptist, SS. Peter and Paul, and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops encourage Christians to use these two weeks to reflect on the importance of religious freedom and to pray for our brothers and sisters who face intense persecution in other parts of the world.

O God our Creator, from your provident hand we have received our right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.
